Floral Napkin Rings

These blooms double as brooches that guests can wear home.

What you'll need

- Flower template
- Regular computer paper
- Scissors
- 2 sheets tissue paper
- Iron
- · Pencil with eraser
- Glue
- 1 x 1-in. cardboard squares (empty cereal or cracker boxes work well)
- Pin backs (available at any crafts store)
- Ribbon
- Napkins

How to make it

- 1. Print the flower template onto the computer paper and cut out.
- 2. Cut four squares of the tissue paper that are slightly larger than the template—three in one color (for the petals) and the fourth in a different shade (for the leaf).
- 3. With the iron on a medium setting, lightly press the paper squares.









- 4. Stack the squares, place the template on top, and trace around it. Cut out. Set aside the square that's in a different shade.
- 5. Arrange the three pieces so that the petals alternate and fan into a full flower. Pinch the center of the flower from the bottom, using the eraser to help poke down the middle. Crease slightly.
- 6. Take your petals apart and restack them with a dab of glue between each layer. Pinch together again and fluff the petals forward.
- 7. Fold the piece of tissue you set aside for the leaf into thirds. Glue to one side of the flower. Allow to dry.
- 8. Cut out a small cardboard square and glue onto a pin back. Glue the opposite side of the cardboard to the base of the flower to complete your pin.
- 9. String a piece of ribbon through your pin and tie it around the napkin and tableware setting.
